Looking after your home - Keeping your home damp-free

It's important to let the air move around your home to stop it becoming damp. Here's what you can do:

- When you are cooking, open the kitchen window
- When you have a bath or shower, keep the bathroom door closed and the window open a little
- Make sure there is space around your furniture the air needs to be able to move around.

Throwing away cooking oil

Take care not to pour oil and fat away down the kitchen sink after you have been cooking.

- Leave the fat or oil to cool down
- Pour it into a leftover plastic pot or tub with a lid
- Throw it away with your normal kitchen rubbish.
