Garden revamp in Devon

At a property inspection last year for a housing scheme in Devon, our Supported Living Housing Officer Ilir Demaj was given a letter that was written by one of the tenants called Christopher. Writing the letter was a good way for Christopher to express his feelings about the garden.

The sloping garden had a crazy paving pathway down to the chicken hutch, which Christopher and all the other tenants cared for. It wasn't easy for them to walk down to the garden, so it was arranged for works to be carried out to landscape the garden, to make it better with a ramp and

rails for extra safety. Unfortunately the company carrying out the work had to stop halfway through and couldn't complete it. This meant that the garden was in a terrible state with no access for the tenants at all.

In Christopher's letter, he wrote about how important the garden was to him. He said: "I like to invite people over like my brother, and I enjoy feeding the birds and squirrels."

Progress Involvement Officer Alan Greig said: "We worked out what we needed to do next. New contractors finished the garden. We made sure that they understood that the tenants' views were a priority. It was great that tenants were involved with the garden design."

Community Champion Awards 2022

Our Community Champion Awards took place in March to recognise the achievements of our supported living tenants, community groups and young volunteers.

We received a range of applications which included five in the Groups category, 17 for the Individual category and three for the Young People category (under age of 25). Our judges scored the categories with their first, second and third choices, and vouchers were given out, ranging from £200 to £25.

With the aim of having a positive impact, supporting independence and creating opportunities, we were particularly thrilled to award two tenants who have additional needs from our supported living schemes.

Rebecca Gammon from Euxton and Andrew Grant Salmon from Worsley were both given a silver award in the Volunteer of the Year category. Progress Involvement Officer Alan Greig, who nominated Rebecca, said: "Rebecca gets involved with many issues and represents tenants' views, championing concerns. Rebecca attends events that have a direct effect on tenants' welfare and has great knowledge on support issues within supported housing."

Rebecca, 39, said: "I am over the moon about winning the award. I get involved in the local community and try to help those who need my support, as we all go through the same things."



Andrew, 30, was nominated by his support worker Angela Hart. She said: "Andrew does a lot of volunteering twice a week. He goes to Blackleach Country Park and Parr Fold Park with a support worker and helps to clean up the park, litter pick, pull out weeds and cut trees down safely."



Andrew said: "I am really pleased with my voucher. I am going to use it to buy a chair so I can sit at my computer."

Chloe Leeland, 16, and Megan Sumner, 17, are two of the Young Volunteer of the Year gold winners. The pair have volunteered at The Base Community Centre in Leyland since they were 13, helping to deliver food parcels and running children's activities.



Andrea Andrews, Youth and Community Worker at The Base, who nominated them, said: "These young women are amazing and dedicate their spare time to helping out. They delivered food parcels and care packs throughout the lockdown period, helping vulnerable people within the community."
